Graduation Requirements

Social Studies	30 Credits	3 Years	World History, U.S. History, American Government and Economics
English	40 Credits	4 Years	
Math	30 Credits	3 Years	Must complete Algebra I standards
Science	20 Credits	2 Years	Physical and Biological Science
Vocational Education	10 Credits	1 Year	Any vocational class or a third year of science
Foreign Language or Fine Arts	10 Credits	1 Year	
Electives	55 Credits		In any area according to student needs. A student must earn 5 credits in a technology course or receive certification of competency.
Health	5 Credits	1 Semester	
Physical Education	20 Credits	2 Years	
Total	220 Credits		

Students must also pass the California High School Exit Exam.



"A-G" Requirements

A.	U.S. History and Social Science	20 Credits	2 Years	
B.	English Composition and Literature	40 Credits	4 Years	
C.	Mathematics	30 Credits	3 Years	Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II or beyond
D.	Laboratory Science	20 Credits	2 Years	Physical & Biological Science
E.	Foreign Language	20 Credits	2 Years	Same Language
F.	Visual and Performing Arts	10 Credits	1 Year	Same Subject
G.	College Preparatory Electives	10 Credits	1 Year	Must be "A-G" Course

California State and University of California Minimum Entrance Requirements

A student's admission to these universities is based upon appropriate SAT/ACT scores and GPA.

GPA is calculated using only those courses listed in the "A-G" course requirements in which a grade of "C" or better was earned in 9th-12th grades. Courses designated with a "P" meet the entrance requirements for most colleges and universities.

College bound students who receive a "D" in college preparatory subjects are encouraged to repeat the course. A "D" is not an acceptable grade for college entrance.
